TOWN MEETING WARRANT SB2 TOWN OF WINCHESTER STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Winchester, in the County of Cheshire in said state, qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Winchester School in said Winchester on Saturday the 6th of February next 2021 at nine o'clock in the forenoon to discuss, debate and amend warrant articles #1 through #30 and to receive the reports of the selectmen, town treasurer and other town officers including the agents and committees, and act thereon. Final vote will be by the official ballot on **Tuesday, March 9, 2021.**

You are hereby notified to meet at the Winchester School, 85 Parker St.in said Winchester on Tuesday the 9th of March next 2021 at eight o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects. The Polls not to close an hour earlier than seven of the clock in the afternoon.

Article 1: To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2: Shall the Town of Winchester raise and appropriate as an operating budget, not including appropriations by special warrant articles and other appropriations voted separately, the amounts set forth on the budget posted with the warrant or as amended by vote of the first session, for the purposes set forth therein, totaling \$3,675,097 (Three million six hundred seventy-five thousand ninety-seven dollars). Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$3,694,477 (Three million six hundred ninety four thousand four hundred seventy-seven dollars), which is the same as last year, with certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

Article 3: Shall the Town of Winchester raise and appropriate the sum of \$309,900 (Three hundred nine thousand nine hundred dollars) for the operations of the Water Department, the funds to be raised by user fees, or act in a manner thereon. This article will not affect taxation. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$309,604 (Three hundred nine thousand six hundred and four dollars) If the appropriation proposed in the article is not approved, the default amount shall be deemed to have been approved. "With certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

Article 4: Shall the Town of Winchester raise and appropriate the sum of \$375,544 (Three hundred seventy-five thousand five hundred and forty-four dollars) for the operations of the Sewer Department, the funds to be raised by user fees, or act in a manner thereon. This article will not affect taxation. Should this article be defeated, the default budget shall be \$389,439 (Three hundred eight nine thousand four hundred and thirty-nine dollars). If the appropriation proposed in the article is not approved, the default amount shall be deemed to have been approved." With certain adjustments required by previous action of the Town of Winchester or by law; or the governing body may hold one special meeting, in accordance with RSA 40:13, X and XVI, to take up the issue of a revised operating budget only. (Majority vote required)

Article 5: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$16,522.00 (sixteen thousand five hundred and twenty two dollars) to be placed in the existing non-lapsing Assessing & Revaluation Capital Reserve Fund established under Article 16 at the March 2006 Town Meeting for the purpose of performing the assessing update or revaluation of the real estate in the Town of Winchester scheduled for 2020-2025.

Article 6: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$10,000 (ten thousand dollars) to be placed into the existing non-lapsing Town Owned Building Upgrades Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of upgrades for Town owned buildings?

Article 8: To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$13,000 (thirteen thousand three hundred dollars) to be placed into the existing non-lapsing Police Cruiser Capital Reserve Fund for the purpose of updating the current Police fleet.

Article 9: To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to enter into a 5-year lease/purchase agreement with a non-appropriation clause in the amount of \$138,200 (one hundred thirty eight thousand two hundred dollars), to be paid in 5-year annual principal and interest payments of \$27,640 (twenty seven thousand six hundred forty dollars) for the purpose of purchasing a 2021 John Deere 544P Wheel Loader, and raise and appropriate the sum of \$27,640 (twenty seven thousand six hundred forty dollars) for the first years payment. Using the current loader as a trade to offset the total cost in the amount \$25,000 and putting a down payment of \$15,000 from the Highway Equipment Capital Reserve Account. At the end of the 5-year lease agreement, the Town will buy and own the 2021 John Deere 544P Wheel Loader for \$1.00 (one dollar). (Majority vote required)

The monies will also assist with running 6 weeks of summer camp which gives children the opportunity to hike, swim, build, craft, participate in special events, sports, engage in cultural literacy programming and so much more.

This replaces RSA 72:28, II in its entirety and no longer requires, "War Time Service", to qualify. (Surviving Spouse also qualifies)
